### Invitation

#### Dear colleague,

I am pleased to announce the official launch of the European Network of Trainers in the Management of Aggression, ENTMA, as a formal European, non-profit association with the aim of uniting and supporting trainers from across Europe who are related to the field of aggression management.

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Since 1998 trainers in the management of aggression from many different European countries and across a variety of (mental) health care sectors and related fields of work have been collaborating within an informal European platform, since 2004 named ENTMA. International networking was made possible by an annual two-day conference for trainers in Amsterdam since 2000.

Both platform and conference were initiated and organised by CONNECTING, a Netherlands based partnership for consultancy and training, and were initially aimed at exchanging perspectives and comparing nature, scope and depth of training in order to influence positive change in relation to the content of aggression management training courses.

In an annual pre-conference setting, next to the main conference, ENTMA started to discuss topics beyond trainer capacities and skills, like research outcomes, registration, guidelines and standards for training, institutional safety, policy, management and organisational aspects towards training.

After years of productive collaboration ENTMA decided in November 2007 to formalise its role, purpose and function in order to evolve into a

European expert reference network for trainers in the management of aggression. Subsequently a steering committee, consisting of representatives from six European countries and from a variety of different backgrounds, sectors and services was nominated to develop a proposed vision, mission and aims for the network.

A founding principle of ENTMA is the belief that training can contribute significantly to efforts in achieving excellence in the management of aggression and violence within health care and related services. A core aim of ENTMA is therefore to articulate the contribution which training can and should make to the safe therapeutic management of aggression and violence at front-line and organisational levels. As a forum of shared collaborative enquiry ENTMA will endeavour to inform and advance critical debates relating to training.

As a network of collective experience and expertise in the field of aggression management ENTMA will strive to establish and maintain links with other national and international networks and groups associated with the management of aggression.

The First General Assembly of ENTMA will take place on Tuesday 18th November 2008 in the 'Amsterdam ArenA' between 17.00 and 17.30 in order to determine its constitution and membership of its initial board. This date will also mark the official launch of ENTMA as a European association. Registered members are invited to attend the General Assembly and have voting rights. Registration as a member of ENTMA is possible from 1 July 2008 on a no fee basis until 1 January 2009.



A two-day conference is to take place on Monday 17th and Tuesday 18th November 2008 in Amsterdam at the same venue, in order to contextualise and celebrate the launch of ENTMA. All trainers, organisations or individual others associated with the management of aggression are invited to attend. In addition to introducing ENTMA, the conference includes key-note addresses, panel-discussions, theme-specific presentations and workshops related to the development of training and practice. The content will cover overviews concerning the design, delivery and evaluation of training across Europe. Parallel sessions will make it possible to attend an individually tailored track of topics to suit one's own professional area of interest and include 'service specific', 'in-depth thematic' and 'practical exchange of physical interventions' themes.

A book of conference proceedings including information on the background of ENTMA will be presented to all delegates at the conference. More information about ENTMA is available at www.entma.eu

On behalf of the members of ENTMA's steering committee, I sincerely hope to meet you all in Amsterdam at 17 and 18 November.

#### From direction of Den Haag/Haarlem:

Stay on the A9 and at Holendrecht intersection follow signs for Almere/Amersfoort/Amsterdam. On the A2 towards Amsterdam take junction 1 for Ouderkerk a/d Amstel/Duivendrecht and follow signs for Amsterdam Zuidoost/Duivendrecht (Burg. Stramanweg).

#### From direction of Zaandam/Den Haag:

From the A10 ringroad follow signs for Utrecht. On the A2 towards Utrecht take Ouderkerk a/d Amstel/Amsterdam Zuidoost junction and then follow signs for Amsterdam Zuidoost/Duivendrecht (Burg. Stramanweg).

#### From direction of Amersfoort:

On the A1 towards Amsterdam take turning at Diemen intersection for A9 towards Amsterdam Zuidoost/Schiphol/Haarlem. Then follow signs for Amsterdam/Zaanstad. On the A2 take junction 1 for Ouderkerk a/d Amstel/ Duivendrecht and follow signs for Amsterdam Zuidoost/Duivendrecht (Burg. Stramanweg).

#### To park at Transferium/P-1:

Drive straight on and follow signs for Amsterdam Zuidoost/Diemen/Venserpolder. Then turn right at Transferium/P-1 junction.

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
